“Camp Bark-i-Tunk Rules & Policies”

The NY State 4-H Dog Program advisory committee is sponsoring this “fun” event to promote socialization and fun for the 4-H dog youth throughout the state.

This event is being organized as a weekend sleep over so that youth who live across the state will have the opportunity to attend. It is being planned as a non-competitive event to promote fun, socialization and positive reinforcement for both youth and dogs. This is not a weekend workshop to learn training for any type of competition in particular.

"All dogs will be evaluated at the first session by the trainers for their appropriateness for the program. In order to ensure the safety of the participants and dogs enrolled in the program, aggressive dogs will be removed from the program. The decision of the trainers is final. By enrolling in the program you agree to these terms and conditions. Please note that the owners and handlers of the dogs shall be solely responsible for any injury or damage caused by their dog."

Who can come: all active 4-H dog program youth ages 8-19. 1 dog per camper. Cloverbuds ages 5-8 must be accompanied by an adult for the entire camping weekend.

Dog Rules:

Participating dogs may not have any uncontrollable dog aggression issues.

No dogs in season or under the age of 6 months.

One dog per camper is allowed.

Dogs must have understanding of basic obedience commands, sit, stay, come and must be comfortable on leash (at least beginner on lead proficient by 4-H standards).

Dogs must be on leash and under handler control at all times.

Dogs must be crated comfortably and quietly at night or on break in their youth's cabin.

You must bring a flat buckle collar for participation in some activities.

You must bring treats, leash, crate, water dish and food for your dog (in air tight container).

You are responsible for cleaning up after your dog at all times. Please bring extra bags!!

People Rules:

Bring with you to camp - sleeping bag; pillow, flashlight; toiletries (tooth brush and paste, soap etc.); towel; clothes for inclement weather (raincoat, jacket or sweatshirt); extra shoes; boots and swimsuit to wear to the shower. You may want an extra blanket.

Bring your favorite music CD, cards/games to play with others in you're cabin or free time. We want this to be a weekend to meet and get to know other youth from the state.

Benefit Auction- We will be holding a benefit auction on Sunday. Please bring dog related items to donate to this fund raiser.

Chaperones - Parents or adults over 21 who are already official 4-H volunteers may be chaperones. Chaperones must attend full camp and attend an orientation on Friday evening. Duties include overseeing a group of campers for the weekend, including activities and staying in the cabin with their group. Please contact the office for more information. Chaperones may not bring a dog. If you are not a 4-H volunteer, contact your local 4-H office to fill out the necessary paperwork.

Cloverbuds ages 5-8 are required to have an adult chaperone the entire weekend. You will not be assigned to supervise a group, only your Cloverbud.

4-H PARTICIPANT CODE OF BEHAVIOR

To help insure safe and successful participation in 4-H events, it is critical that we share with you an understanding of what is expected. Hopefully, this will prevent unhappy situations from developing due to the absence of necessary guidelines. The following is an honor code of behavior and subsequent consequences for misbehavior.

1. EXPECTED BEHAVIOR

- ◆ 4-H participants (youth and adults) at a 4-H function are expected to be on time, follow through on tasks/responsibilities they are there for, behave in a manner that insures safety, well-being, and educational experience for themselves and others involved.
- ◆ Adults and youth are expected to act in a mature, responsible manner, recognizing they are role models and representing themselves and Delaware County 4-H.
- ◆ Both youth and adults should be dressed presentably and appropriately.

MEANS OF ENSURING EXPECTED BEHAVIOR

- ◆ Adult chaperones will be with the participants during the event. A meeting covering authority, responsibility, guidelines, and emergency action will take place between staff member(s) and chaperone(s).
- ◆ This statement signed by both 4-H'er and parent agreeing to rules and consequences must be submitted prior to the event.

2. MISBEHAVIOR

- ◆ Possession and /or use of illegal drugs or alcohol by 4-H members and chaperones participating in a 4-H event are prohibited.
- ◆ Smoking is prohibited on camp grounds.
- ◆ Display of public affection is inappropriate.
- ◆ Stealing or other illegal behaviors that violate others' rights are prohibited.
- ◆ Any behavior that places the safety and well-being of the individual or others at risk is prohibited.

CONSEQUENCES

- ◆ In mild cases, a warning will be given.
- ◆ Able to remain at event, but barred from future event.
- ◆ Sent home at family's expense.

Supervising Chaperone Policy

Selection

1. Chaperones must be official 4-H volunteers.
2. Chaperones should be selected according to the maximum educational value they can add to the event.
3. They should be able to exercise mature judgment and action to assure the health and safety of all participants.
4. They should be recognized by the youth as mature adults.
5. In age, they must be at least 21 years of age. It would be best if there was at least four years between the participants and the chaperone's age.
6. If the chaperone is asked to also be a driver, they need to have at least two years of driving experience and have a good driving record.
7. They should have knowledge of the purpose of the event, the types of activities that will be part of the event. Any specific responsibilities and its relationship to the overall 4-H Program.

Authority

1. Chaperones should be delegated full authority to make the same type of decisions, as would an Extension Educator if one was available. If more than one chaperone is present, one chaperone would be placed "In Charge," and therefore responsible for working together with all the other chaperones at making decisions.
2. This authority might include such things as discipline- making recommendations for withdrawal from the event and/or loss of prizes, calling parents and/or sending youth home. It would also include any decisions about the appropriate time to leave events in case of an emergency or bad weather conditions.
3. For the well-being of the group, it should be understood by youth and adults that the Chaperones will exercise "on the spot" responsibility for all youth, whether the youth are from their county or not. Any action must be then communicated to the appropriate person in leadership in the "outside" county.
4. Chaperones will be familiar with the Code of Conduct for both youth and volunteers, and they will uphold its stand.
5. Chaperones should know the name of the person(s) responsible for conducting the event, and should contact that person for clarification of stated rules of the event and any needed discussion of possible extenuating circumstances and possible solutions to those issues.

Duties

1. Chaperones are expected to provide twenty-four hour supervision for their charges.
2. They should adhere to the same schedule as established for youth. For example; night curfews should be observed by all.

The only exception to this rule would be if chaperones have made an arrangement among themselves as to their hours of being "On Duty" or "Off Duty."

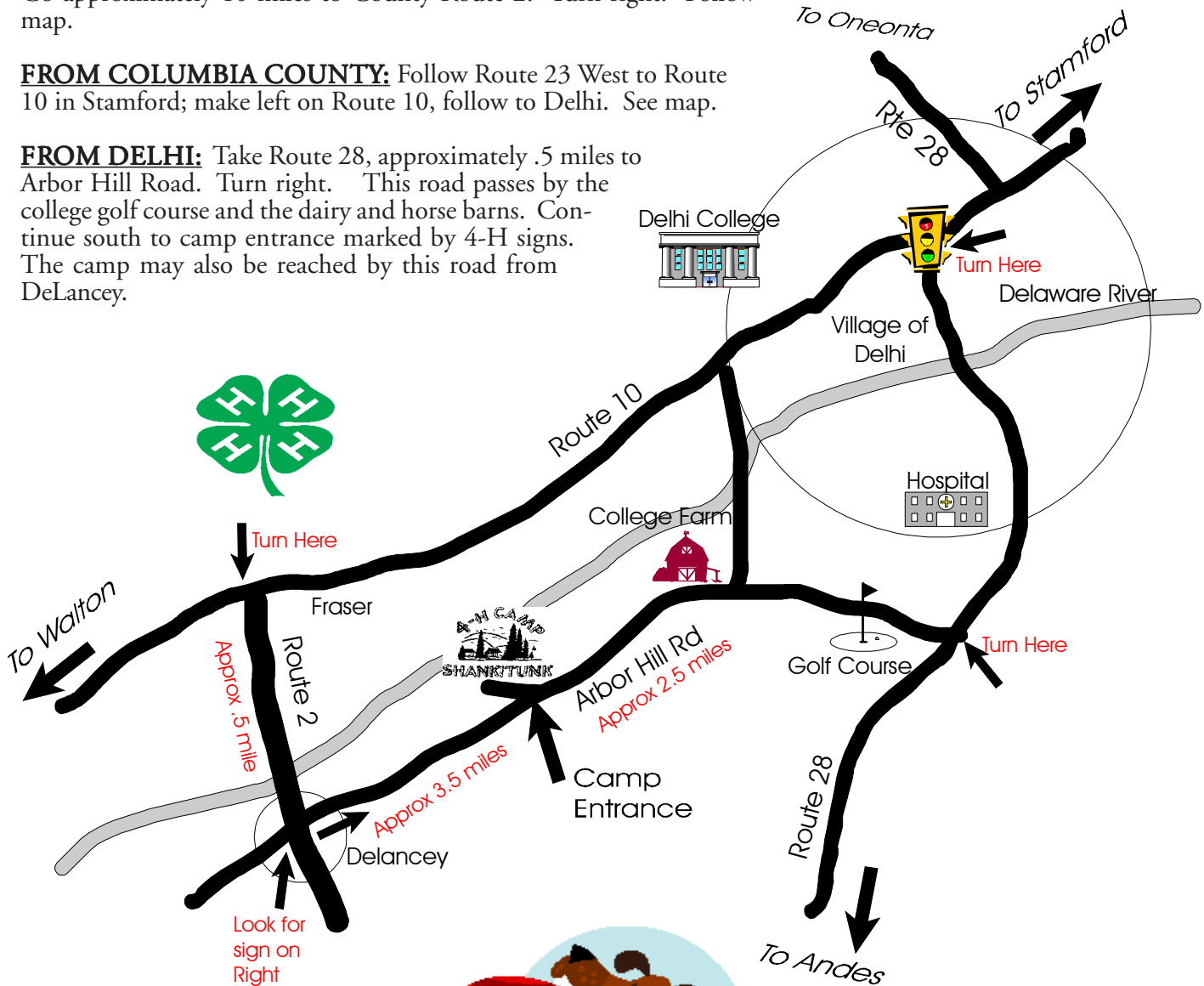
DIRECTIONS TO 4-H CAMP SHANKITUNK:

FROM ROUTE 88 (Oneonta): Take Route 28 East toward Delhi and Kingston. From the traffic light in Delhi take Route 28 approximately .5 miles to Arbor Hill Road. Follow map.

FROM ROUTE 17 (Roscoe): Exit at Roscoe, follow Route 206 to Walton; make a right on Route 10. Go approximately 10 miles to County Route 2. Turn right. Follow map.

FROM COLUMBIA COUNTY: Follow Route 23 West to Route 10 in Stamford; make left on Route 10, follow to Delhi. See map.

FROM DELHI: Take Route 28, approximately .5 miles to Arbor Hill Road. Turn right. This road passes by the college golf course and the dairy and horse barns. Continue south to camp entrance marked by 4-H signs. The camp may also be reached by this road from DeLancey.
